

Eupatorium havanense



Plant Type: Perennial, Shrub



Bloom Season: April – Dec



Plant Height: 3-4 ft. tall



Plant Spread: 3-4 ft. wide



Larval Host: Rawson's Metalmark



Use: Erosion Control



Planting Depth: Dig a hole as deep as the pot the plant came in, and twice as wide.



Soil Conditions: Well-drained, sand, loam, clay



Light Requirement: Full, partial, shade



Water Requirement: Low



Attracts: Butterflies, Hummingbirds, Bees



Plant Resistance: Deer, Rabbit



Maintenance: Blooms best and appears bushier if severely cut back each winter.

Resilience: From droughts to the deepest of freezes, these Texas-natives are capable and resilient.



Planting Tips: Pair this beautiful dappled shade-loving native with Turk's Cap and Frostweed, and get ready for an extravaganza of a fall show.

Growing Comments: Fragrant Mistflower is a valuable native nectar and a slow grower. Year 1, it sleeps. Year 2, it creeps. Year 3, it leaps!
