Conoclinium greggii



Plant Type: Perennial



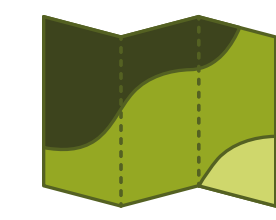
Bloom Season: Mar – Nov



Plant Height: 1-2 ft. tall



Plant Spread: 18 in. wide



Larval Host: Rawson's Metalmark



Use: Erosion Control



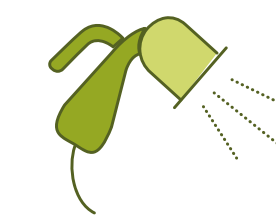
Planting Depth: Dig a hole as deep as the pot the plant came in, and twice as wide.



Soil Conditions: Well-drained, sand, loam, clay, limestone



Light Requirement: Full, partial



Water Requirement: Low



Attracts: Butterflies, Bees



Plant Resistance: Deer, Rabbit



Maintenance: Cut back to the ground after the last frost. Cut back between flowering periods to encourage more blooms.

Resilience: From droughts to the deepest of freezes, these Texas-natives are capable and resilient.



Planting Tips: If you buy only ONE native nectar for your habitat, it's gotta be Gregg's Blue Mistflower! Plant in clusters for a guaranteed pollinator party! Spreads easily by roots and can be used as a ground cover.

Growing Comments: Gregg's Blue Mistflower is a valuable native nectar and a slow grower. Year 1, it sleeps. Year 2, it creeps. Year 3, it leaps!
