



Texas Lantana

Lantana urticoides



Plant Type: Perennial, Shrub



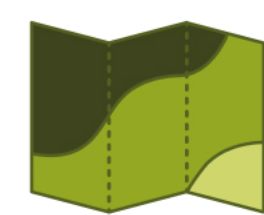
Bloom Season: April – Nov



Plant Height: 3-6 ft. tall



Plant Spread: 3-6 ft. wide



Larval Host: Grey Hairstreak



Use: Erosion Control



Planting Depth: Dig a hole as deep as the pot the plant came in, and twice as wide.



Soil Conditions: Well-drained, sand, loam, clay, caliche



Light Requirement: Full sun



Water Requirement: Low



Attracts: Butterflies, Bees



Seeds: Birds



Plant Resistance: Deer, Rabbit



Maintenance: Trim back to 6 inches after last frost. Prune between flowering periods to shape and encourage more blooms.

Resilience: From droughts to the deepest of freezes, these Texas-natives are capable and resilient.



Planting Tips: Make sure to give this one space to flex. It steals the show in the summer. A must have for your pollinator nectar bar! Suggestion – wear gloves or sleeves when pruning as the leaves contain a mild irritant.

Growing Comments: Texas Lantana is a valuable native nectar and a slow grower. Year 1, it sleeps. Year 2, it creeps. Year 3, it leaps!
