

Mealy Blue Sage Salvia farinacea




Plant Type: Perennial

Soil Conditions: Well-drained, sand, loam, clay, caliche




Light Requirement: Full, partial sun



Water Requirement: Low



Attracts: Butterflies, Hummingbirds, Native Bees



Seeds: Birds



Plant Resistance: Deer, Rabbit



Maintenance: Option to cut back halfway after the spring wave of flowering to encourage a more compact and robust blooming shape

Resilience: From droughts to the deepest of freezes, these Texas-natives are capable and resilient.



Planting Tips: Plant in large clusters of 3-5 for impressive impact

Growing Comments: Mealy Blue Sage is a valuable native nectar and a slow grower. Year 1, it sleeps. Year 2, it creeps. Year 3, it leaps!

Plant Height: 2-3 ft. tall





Planting Depth: Dig a hole as deep as the pot the plant came in, and twice as wide.

Plant Spread: 2-3 ft. wide

Use: Erosion Control
