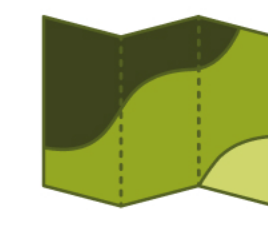




Plant Height: 2-3 ft. tall



Plant Spread: 2-3 ft. wide



Larval Host: Istar Sphinx



Use: Erosion Control



Planting Depth: Dig a hole as deep as the pot the plant came in, and twice as wide.



Soil Conditions: Well-drained, sand, loam, clay



Light Requirement: Full, partial, dappled



Water Requirement: Low to medium



Attracts: Butterflies, Hummingbirds



Plant Resistance: Deer, Rabbit



Maintenance: After the last frost, cut back to create more shape. How far to cut back? A third to halfway, you choose! You're the plant stylist. Alternatively, let it grow wild and just prune/pluck the pent tips for that devil-may-care look.

Resilience: From droughts to the deepest of freezes, these Texas-natives are capable and resilient.



Planting Tips: Autumn Sage adds lovely structure to a habitat. We like planting this small, yet hearty shrub next to other powerhouses, like Texas Lantana and Purple Skullcap.

Growing Comments: Autumn Sage is a valuable native nectar and a slow grower. Year 1, it sleeps. Year 2, it creeps. Year 3, it leaps!
